1) Actions from last meeting

Cycle way maintenance is carried out as and when it is reported, there is no regular maintenance. Lynne has emailed Steve Alexander but has had no response. It was agreed that everyone should report via the CCC link. The link is on the Parish Council website and is below:

Moving village Boundary sign has not yet been actioned. **ACTION CU**

Silver Street cut back done, thanks to Lynne for organising

Clearing chicane; it has been established that Handymen cannot work on Highway.

All other actions covered in agenda.

2) Speed watch

This needs to be reinstated as soon as possible. Gerald will enquire about training. **ACTION GS**

Caroline will contact Emma about how to take this forward **ACTION CU**

It was agreed that we would use Speedwatch to assess the possible areas for additional MVAS units.

The possible places are:

- Lucks Lane by cemetery
- Church Street by the Church
- Stirtloe Lane

It was agreed that Gerald will contact installer of MVAS units to put the two additional units up in Mill Road until a decision about where else to site them is made. **ACTION GS**

One of the ways of addressing the speeding in Silver Street may be to move the 20mph sign nearer to the A1 particularly in anticipation of the new development being built.

3) PFHI bids

These are still scheduled to be going ahead. Amy will chase as there has been no recent update. **ACTION AB**

Once the current projects are complete, we will consider what else we might do and will probably apply for the next LHI bids where we can get 10k towards projects.

4) Cycleway Caroline will email Claire about the cycle route project. **ACTION CU**

Lynne said that she had contacted community pay back about them clearing the path, they can only work in a 30 mph zone but they could still clear quite a lot. The path by the Black Bull is particularly bad. As the path is in Brampton this is their responsibility. CU will discuss this with Mike Bainbridge Chair of Brampton Parish Council at the next meeting with him. (this has been changed and is now re-scheduled for Thursday 14t April). Amy has raised it with prospective councillors.

5) **Pavement survey**

This is in progress not all are yet complete Caroline is collating.

6) **Active travel bid**

The installation of two cycle racks has been agreed, one in High Street one at Village Hall. CU had contacted the Lion, they were interested in principle but did not respond to Caroline's follow up email.

They will also be installing a temporary chicane at the top of the High Street to slow traffic as it comes off the A1.

7) **AOB**

It was agreed that we would consider priorities from the focus group meeting at each Highways meeting.

The cycle/footway from Greenway to the Marina is a priority. We cannot afford to have a larger path put in but Gerald will investigate whether grass has encroached across the path and if so we will commission full clearance. **ACTION GS**

Lynne asked that we raise the issue of drop kerb at North Lodge and the layby near Southoe at the next meeting with Highways. Alan Marne chair of Southoe Parish Council has been leading on this and we raise it at each meeting.
