ACTION CU

Actions from the last meeting 6th March 2023:

Village Sign is being pursued by Cllr Peter Clark **PC**, as a business case was required for this from the authority.

Speed Watch:

One Speed Watch was cancelled due to weather and the unit had a charging issue which has now been resolved by **CG**.

MVAS units data has been sent to the **Clerk RM** and **CG** has collated this information with Cllr Sue Ashwell **SA**, as **CG** is using this and other gathered speed watch in a report at the Annual Assembly.

EL and **CG** will look at another method of producing the Data from **MVAS** units to make understanding clearer.

We discussed the possibility of a village wide 20mph zone. We will begin consultation with an article in the roundabout . **GS** to draft **ACTION GS**

PFHI bids:

CU has been informed by Cambridgeshire Council Highways **CCH** that the yellow lines around Hunts end that have been an issue for some time now will be undertaken as a private local highways initiative.

Cycleway:

Ready to go but Finance worries over the £100K **HDC** and £80k from the **BPC** may not be the final figure due to delays, but this delay is not of **BPC** making. **Claire Rankin** has intimated that hopefully this work will be **completed** before School reconvenes in **September 2023**. An emergency Finance meeting maybe required on the above subject.

Mill Road:

Mill Road footpath survey carried out by **TJH** reported that the hedge in places was encroaching the footpath which wanted attention as for the safety all users; **TJH** will continue a watching brief on this area. **ACTION TJH**

Pavement and Road Survey:

CU mentioned that incredible work was carried out on the footpath surveys last year by **volunteers**, so this was quite disappointing in the respect that no action had come from this great amount of time a foot slogging around the village. It was agreed that this work would be resubmitted as no action from this had been forthcoming.
